I. Introduction or Forward (A brief account on the unit's origin and its accomplishments over the years and a statement about the current period covered)

On 1 September, 2006, Co E was founded as a result of modular reorganization within 55 HBCT, 28 ID. Formerly Company A was assigned to the 728th Support Battalion(Main), the battalion was an element of the $28^{\rm th}$ DISCOM. Presently Company E is an FSC, the company supports the 1-109th IN. The present commander of Company E is 1LT Meadow Reeder.

- * In November, 2007, 37 soldiers mobilized in support of the Multinational Force and Observers (MFO) in the Egyptian Sinai peninsula in order to help maintain the peace treaty between the Egyptians and the Israelis.
- * In November, 2007, 7 soldiers mobilized in support of Operation Enduring Freedom 8 (OEF) along with hundreds of other soldiers within 55HBCT in order to ensure political and social stabilization within the country of Afghanistan.
- * In June, 2008, Company E attended annual training (AT) at Ft. Pickett, VA with the 1-109 IN and successfully sustained the battalion (Task Force Blue Steel) with a significantly degraded number of personnel due to deployments. At AT, Co E performed Class I Operations provided 7,966 Meals, Class III Operations was responsible for the disposition of 4900 Gallons of Fuel, Class V Operations supported and worked with the S-4 in the Requisition, Issuance, Tracking, Accountability, Transportation and Turn In of Excess/Unused Class V and Residue Turn In(The Ranges supported in the Class V Operations were BCPC Range 15 MPRC, BT VI (MOD) Range 15 (MPRC), TCPC Range 15 and TT VI (MOD) Range 15 (MPRC), Class IX Operations, Recovery, and Wheeled & Track Support. With a Scope Focus on Maintenance Operations, it is to be said, The Maintenance Operations were a success during AT, even with the number of limited personnel in critical areas. Attained an OPERATIONAL READINESS RATE AT OR ABOVE 90%. Additionaly 58 faults repaired on the equipment and 6 Annual Services performed on wheeled vehicle.
